- 01  God is Loving, Beautiful, Living, Everlasting, Compassionate, and Forgiving. Remember that.
- 02  'God' in English is 'Allah' in Arabic. He is the Lord of Abraham, Moses, Jesus, and Muhammad.
- 03  You need to find God. You can do so by reading the Quran and reflecting on nature.



- 04  Islam is about God first and foremost. Everything in Islam is about submitting to God with love, hope, and fear of being distant from Him.
- 05  'Allah' is the God of Judaism and Christianity. Arab Jews and Christians refer to God as 'Allah.'
- 06  12 million Christian Arabs and Arab Jews call God 'Allah.'



- 07  Trust in God and He will help you understand that He is sufficient for all your needs.
- 08  Know that you are the creation of God and so are others. Know what you owe them of rights.
- 09  The best remedy for those who are afraid, lonely or unhappy is to be alone with God in prayer.



- 10  The Quran is one of the greatest blessings of God. God is the Author, salvation is its goal, and truth is its content.
- 11  Nothing is like God. He has no family, wife, son, helper, aid, or assistant.
- 12  God manages your affairs and does not need any advice from you. With God in charge, everything will work out fine in the end.



- 13  Go to God with tears in your eyes and say, 'Please forgive me!' He loves to forgive.
- 14  When trouble comes, focus on God's ability to take care of you. God is powerful.
- 15  The statement "God has a son" almost causes the heavens to be torn apart, the earth to split asunder, the mountains to crumble to pieces.



16



“The creation has a Creator.” Every child in this world is born with this intuition.

17



People argue about morals, but God decides right and wrong for God is Wise. He gives us our wisdom after all!

18



God is the ‘Author’ of your life. Let Him write it.



- 19  Always look upon yourselves as God's servants, placed in God's world, to do God's work by serving Him and His creation.
- 20  God does not reside in idols, human beings, nature, or the cosmos. He is above His creation, yet close to us.
- 21  The most fundamental teaching of Islam is that the sole purpose of our creation is to worship and serve God.



- 22  The essence of Islam: worship God, follow the Prophet Muhammad, and serve humanity.
- 23  Muslims love and believe in Jesus as a prophet, but they don't worship Him or think he was the son of God.
- 24  Muslims love and respect Mary, she delivered Jesus without a human father, but they don't pray to her.



25



Prayer, worship, charity, and fasting are all for God, not to earn the praise of people.

26



God meets your needs every day, not weekly or annually. He will give you what you need when it is needed.

27



Muslims do not pray to saints or think that they have superpowers; they pray to God only.



28



You become a Muslim by saying and believing, 'No one has the right to be worshipped except Allah and Muhammad is the prophet of Allah.'

29



God has beautiful Names that describe Him like the Most Merciful, the Forgiver of Sins, and the Acceptor of Repentance.

30



God is merciful to ALL of His creation: He made them, He feeds them, He cares for them. All He wants is that they worship Him.



- 31  A man who has faith in God does not worry when the world tries to pull him down because he knows God's hand is holding him up!
- 32  God said, '***My mercy precedes My wrath.***' (Sahih Muslim)
- 33  Those who happily leave everything in God's hand, will eventually see God's hand in everything because worry ends when faith begins.







- 01  Islam is a peaceful religion of worship and submission to God.
- 02  Only 15% of Muslims are Arabs. Indonesia has the largest Muslim population.
- 03  The very word “Islam” comes from salaam, the word for “Peace.” The universal Muslim greeting is “as salaamu alaikum” – “peace be on you!”



04



Islam does not oppress women, but calls for their rights, including education.

05



Islam is against fanaticism, extremism, and terrorism and promotes moderation, peace, tolerance, and co-existence.

06



A Muslim is a person who believes in and practices Islam. There are 1.6 billion Muslims in the world today from all races and backgrounds.



07



The Quran is the holy book of Islam and Muhammad is the prophet of Islam.

08



Muslims believe in all the prophets of God: Abraham, Isaac, Ishmael, Jacob, Joseph, Moses, John, and Jesus.

09



The essential beliefs of Islam are the articles of faith: belief in God, His angels, prophets, heavenly books, the Afterlife, & destiny.





**Quran**



- 01  The Quran is the sacred book of Islam, the speech of God, a guidance and mercy for mankind, and the miracle of the Prophet Muhammad.
- 02  The Quran was revealed in Arabic from God to the Prophet Muhammad through the Angel Gabriel over a period of 23 years.
- 03  Today, the Quran is recited exactly as it was recited by the Prophet Muhammad 1400 years ago.



- 04  The Quran was memorized in its entirety and written down in the life of the Prophet Muhammad and has reached us the way it was revealed.
- 05  Muslims recite portions of Quran in their daily prayers. The Quran has been recited the world over in Ramadan for the last 1400 years.
- 06  Countless people have memorized the Quran in its entirety since the time of the Prophet Muhammad. Its preservation is God's miracle.



- 07  Without knowing the circumstances behind its revelation, it is possible to misunderstand the Quran.
- 08  The Quran is in Arabic, has 114 chapters, about 600 pages, and has been translated into 40 languages.
- 09  The Quran is true because it has scientific information that was unknown 1400 years ago; it could only come from God.



- 10  ***'This is the Book, concerning which there is no doubt, a guidance for those who obey God.'*** (Quran 2:2)
- 11  Muslims love, respect, memorize, and recite the Quran.
- 12  The Quran asks its readers to contemplate its claims and to reach rational conclusions with their mind.



13



The Message of the Quran: know and worship God, accept His prophets, follow the last Prophet (Muhammad) and serve humanity.

14



The goals of the Quran: know God, know how to worship God, live a life God wants, reform yourself, create a spiritual and just society.

15



The Quran is true because it has reached us like no other heavenly book and has scientific information that no other heavenly book does.



- 16  The Message of the Quran is peace and reconciliation, even war is regulated and prisoners are given rights and human dignity.
- 17  The Quran was written down by select scribes in the time of the Prophet Muhammad and memorized and recited five times in daily prayers.
- 18  The Quran is not organized by subject matter or in chronological order and its power lies in recitation and listening to it in Arabic.



- 19  The Quran has scientific information on the embryo, mountains, seas, the creation of the universe, etc. Its source must be God.
- 20  The longest chapter of the Quran has 286 verses, the shortest has 3.
- 21  The Quran has 114 chapters and 114 times the Quran says 'In the Name of God, the Most Merciful, the Compassionate'.



22



Translations of Quran are just that. The Quran is only in Arabic as it was revealed; no other scripture is like that.

23



The Quran emphasizes the kind treatment of women, poor, slaves, and orphans.

24



The Quran paints the picture of the end of the world in graphic detail.



25



The Quran frequently talks about God's coming judgment so we can live responsibly.

26



The Quran has stories of past prophets, prophecies of the future, and the working of God in the present all tied to God's power.

27



The Quran stresses God's judgment and forgiveness, God's justice and mercy, God's might and forbearance all at the same time.



28



Focus of the Quran: serve and worship God in all you do, in how you live, and how you interact with people and your environment.

29



***'...for without doubt in the remembrance of God do hearts truly find rest.'*** (Quran 13:28)

30



***'And it is He (God) who causes laughter and tears.'*** (Quran 54:43)





**Prophet Muhammad**



- 01  Muhammad was the last and final prophet sent by God to all of humanity as a mercy to the creation.
- 02  Muhammad was born as an orphan and raised by his grandfather and uncle in the city of Mecca.
- 03  “I became more than ever convinced that it was not the sword that won a place for Islam in those days...” Gandhi.



04



“The Message of Muhammad was, and remains to this day, a message of peace, mercy, and compassion.” Bill Baker, Christian scholar.

05



Muhammad was severely persecuted, but forgave his enemies even when he could exact revenge.

06



God raised an orphan child from the Arabian desert to be His greatest and last prophet to humanity.



07



Muhammad did pick up arms to defend the weak and to spread peace and justice, yet he dealt fairly with his enemies.

08



Many of the worst enemies of Muhammad eventually accepted Islam due to his compassion, mercy, and exemplary morals.


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Muhammad always preferred peace over war and made treaties to end hostilities on every possible occasion.



- 10  Muhammad and his followers were forced out of their homes twice, yet he prayed for his enemies and forgave them.
- 11  Muhammad lived to the age of 63, receiving the first revelation at age 40, married, raised children, step-children, and grandchildren.
- 12  Muhammad could neither read nor write, yet the Quran he transmitted is a literary masterpiece and the basis of all Arabic language.



13



Muhammad was born in Mecca, died and buried in Madina; both cities are in present-day Saudi Arabia.

14



The Bible has numerous prophecies about Muhammad, both in the Old Testament and the New Testament, from both Moses and Jesus.

16



Muhammad was humble, he did not claim to have powers of God; even the miracles he performed, he attributed them to God.



16



The Message of Muhammad: worship the God of Abraham, equality of human beings, women's rights, and social justice.

17



Central cities in Muhammad's life: Mecca, Madina, and Jerusalem.

18



Muhammad was a man of integrity: he never compromised on his principles even in the most perilous situations.





- 19  Daughter of violent opponent married Muhammad and loved him till his death. Signs of a true prophet of God and man of character.
- 20  Muhammad was an orphan who could not read or write, got married at 25, became a prophet at 40, and died at 63.
- 21  Humility of Muhammad: he strictly forbade his followers from over-praising him like Christians did to Jesus.



22



Humility of Muhammad: he disliked that people stand up for him.

23



Miracles of Muhammad witnessed by people: split the moon, food increased, rain poured by his prayers, and he healed the sick.

24



All his children died in his lifetime except one, his enemies united to fight against him, yet Muhammad was the most joyful of people.




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His uncle was murdered, he was driven out of his homeland, bounty was offered for his assassination, yet Muhammad forgave his enemies.

- 01  Islam is easy to follow. Basic Islamic beliefs and practices are summarized in 6 'articles of faith' and 5 'pillars of Islam'.
- 02  6 articles of Islamic faith: belief in God, His angels, prophets, revealed books, the Afterlife, and destiny.
- 03  5 'pillars' of Islam: testifying the Oneness of God and prophethood of Muhammad, 5 daily prayers, charity, fasting Ramadan, & pilgrimage.



04



Essence of Islam, main teaching of all prophets, and the 1st article of Islamic belief: belief in the One God and worshipping Him alone.

05



Belief in God in Islam means that only Allah is the Lord; worship Him alone, and know Him by His unique Names and attributes.

06



'Shirk' is the biggest, and only unforgivable, sin in Islam: to worship other objects or beings, or to associate them with God in worship.



07



Shirk is the only sin that God will not forgive from a person who dies without repenting from it.

08



Angels are obedient to God; there are no fallen angels who rebel against Him.

09



God made angels of light, they bring His messages, and carry out His commands in the universe.



- 10  Angels keep constant company with human beings and record their good and bad deeds.
- 11  God communicates with human beings through messengers whom He sent to all people, the last of whom was Muhammad.
- 12  Every prophet – including Abraham, Moses, Jesus, Muhammad - brought the same message from God: worship Him alone.



13



To be a Muslim, one must honor and love Moses, John the Baptist, Mary, and Jesus.

14



In Islam, Jesus is a special prophet of God, the Messiah, and born without a father, but he is not the son of God.

15



To be a Muslim, one must believe that God sent down the Torah, the Gospel, the Psalms, and the Quran.



- 16  The Torah, Gospel, and Psalms of today are not the original ones God revealed; no originals exist, and different versions are read.
- 17  The Quran is God's final revelation to humanity, it exists in its original language and was passed down by memory and in writing.
- 18  Islam teaches of life after death, where people will be judged for their deeds that will determine their eternal fate: Paradise or Hell.



19



If the world were free of problems, Paradise would lose its value.

20



God will bring people back to life and judge them with mercy and justice.

21



Nothing happens to us in life out of pure chance: God knows how to shift things around so you can be where you were meant to be.



22



You decide your fate by the choices you make, God happens to already know it.

23



Destiny is not a matter of chance, but choice. You don't wait for it, but achieve it.

24



Fruits are squeezed for juice, diamonds come from pressure. If you are being pushed in life, it's just God bringing the best out of you.



25



Anyone can become a Muslim by a simple declaration of faith: only God deserves worship and Muhammad is His messenger.

26



You can become Muslim no matter where you are in life: white, black, homeless, addicted, gay, woman, young, old, rich, or poor.

27



God's forgiveness and mercy are open to every human being without exception.



28



Five daily prayers keep a Muslim connected with God, you ask and listen to God at the same time.

29



Muslims interrupt their life to pray every day; it is a source of strength, tranquility, and brings focus back to God.

30



When there is no shoulder to cry on, there is the floor; cry in prostration to the Lord and your problems will go away.



- 02  "...the Koran instructs all Muslims to make caring for widows, orphans, and refugees a priority." Greg Mortenson, Three Cups of Tea.
- 03  Islam lays the highest standards of morality by implanting the belief that we are dealing with God Who sees us at all times and places.



04



In how we deal with fellow human beings, a Muslim seeks God's pleasure not human praise.

05



In Islam, kindness was emphasized with parents, spouses, orphans, widows, the poor, and indeed with every living thing.

06



Muslims show kindness to the poor by giving zakah (required charity) to the needy and the poor.

07



Kindness is not found in anything but it adds to its beauty and it is not withdrawn from anything but it makes it defective – Muhammad.

08



Islam not only commands equality, but makes Muslims live by it in their daily prayers and pilgrimage.

09



Equality is not theoretical, it is realized in daily worship where Muslims from different backgrounds stand next to each other in prayer.



- 10  Equality is seen in Hajj, the pilgrimage to Mecca. Muslims dress in simple clothes. All worldly differences are eliminated before God.
- 11  Islam instructs Muslims to seek justice, but it also reminds them of the value of forgiveness.
- 12  ***'Show forgiveness, speak for justice and the avoid the ignorant.'*** (Quran 7:199)



- 13  The Quran asks a Muslim to be kind to his parents (31:14), wife (4:19), and speak kindly with people. (2:83)
- 14  A half-truth is a whole lie. Being truthful and honest are virtues every Muslim is encouraged to have in Islam.
- 15  With lies you may get ahead in the world - but you lose God being on your side.



- 16  A lie has speed, but truth has endurance; ***'Truth has come, and falsehood has faded: indeed falsehood is bound to fade.'*** (Quran 17:81)
- 17  It was pride that caused Satan to fall from grace and it was with humility that Adam came close to God.
- 18  Being humble means acting modestly, avoiding arrogance and boasting, and decency in clothing and behavior.



19



A Muslim woman covering herself in hijab is an act of modesty, humility, and respect, not male domination or oppression.

20



Do you wish to rise? Begin by descending. Islam teaches you humility by asking you to put your head on the ground at least five times a day.

21



***“A visitor walking to visit a sick person will be wading in the mercy of God”.*** Prophet Muhammad, the prophet of mercy.



22



***“When the visitor sits with the sick one, they will be immersed in mercy until they get up”.*** Prophet Muhammad.

23



Islam teaches you empathy by visiting the sick: by understanding that someone else's pain is as meaningful as yours.

24



The Prophet Muhammad led by example, he would make time to personally visit the sick and enquire after them through others.



25



***‘Battle your selfishness by being generous with your time, talent, and money and God will repay it.’*** (Quran 2:272)

26



God is al-Kareem (“The Most Generous”), God’s prophet was generous, and Muslims are taught to be generous.

27



True generosity is an offering, given freely and out of pure love. No strings attached. No expectations except from God Himself.



28



The Prophet Muhammad taught us compassion by practicing generosity with others, especially in Ramadan, the month of fasting.

29



Generosity must be practiced without vanity and showing-off. That is the essence of sincerity and true compassion.

30



Islam is a religion of tolerance, it condemns persecution and oppression of others and built a legacy of tolerance and co-existence.



31



Diversity is a sign of God, '*...the variations in your languages and your colors. Indeed, in that are signs ...*' (Quran 30:22)

32



Racism is one of the worst forms of discrimination in our world today. Islam forbade it 1400 years ago.

"America needs to understand Islam, because this is the one religion that erases from its society the race problem." Malcolm X.

**Contributions of Islamic  
Civilization**



- 01  Qarawiyn University in Morocco is the oldest running university in the world. It was founded by Fatima al-Fihria, a Muslim woman.
- 02  The second oldest university in the world is Al-Azhar University, founded in Cairo, Egypt in the tenth century.
- 03  Malala Yousafzai, a Muslim girl, won the 2014 Noble Peace Prize for advocating the right of all children to education.



- 04  The Umayyad rulers of Spain had a library of 600,000 volumes in their huge Cordoba library.
- 05  Muslims translated the works of Greek physicians like Hippocrates, Dioscorides, Galen, and others into Arabic.
- 06  The 1st modern hospitals were built in the Muslim world; Harun al-Rashid, a Muslim ruler, created the 1st modern hospital in 803 CE.



07



Abu Bakr ar-Razi, called Rhazes in the West, wrote more than 300 books and was a master of experimental medicine.

08



Ar-Razi made discoveries and wrote treatises on pediatrics, oral hygiene, smallpox, measles, allergies, scabies, and kidney stones.

09



Rhazes encouraged cure through healthy and regulated food, emphasizing psychological factors on health.






- 10  Ibn Sina, known in the West as Avicenna, wrote the 'Canon of Medicine' taught in universities in France and Italy from 1216-th century.
- 11  'Canon' of Avicenna was a million words, summarized Greek medicine, had anatomical drawings, and described diseases and their cures.
- 12  Works of more than 400 Muslim physicians and authors were translated into European languages in the Middle Ages.



- 13  Muslim astronomers built observatories all over the Islamic world and refined Ptolemy's catalog and coordinates for the stars.
- 14  In the 11th century, al-Tusi of Baghdad invented instruments used to compute and measure positions of stars.
- 15  Kerim Kerimov (1917–2003) was a Muslim Azerbaijani-Russian rocket scientist and a founder of the Soviet space industry.



16



Kerim Kerimov was lead architect behind the launch of the first satellite in 1957 and the first human spaceflight in 1961.

17



The world owes the concept of zero to Muslim mathematicians who first introduced it.

18



The numerals we use today were transmitted to the Western world by Muslim scholars in 8th century CE.

Muslim physicist Ibn Al-Haytham (965-1040 C.E.) calculated the height of Earth's atmosphere to be 32 miles, and was only one mile off!

20



al-Khawarizmi was one of the greatest mathematicians produced by the Islamic civilization.

21



al-Khawarizmi is known as the founder of algebra who also gave the concept of an algorithm, a building block of modern computer science.

Al-Biruni



22



al-Khawarizmi developed solutions for linear and quadratic equations and detailed trigonometric tables, geometry, and arithmetic.

23



Al-Biruni, a famous mathematician, wrote about Earth's rotation, calculated latitude and longitude, and used math to determine seasons.

24



Munir Nayfeh, a Muslim Palestinian-American particle physicist, did pioneering work in nanotechnology that gave us electron microscopes.

Jabir bin Hayyan discovered the sulphuric and nitric acids and built a precise scale.



Ahmed Zewail

- 28  More than 20 lab instruments used today such as the crucible, cucurbit, or retort for distillation were developed in Muslim civilization.
- 29  The main chemistry textbook for medieval Europe, Sum of Perfection, was written by a Muslim Iraqi scholar (801-873).
- 30  Ahmed Zewail, originally from Egypt, won the 1999 Noble Prize in Chemistry.

Omar Yaghi, Jordanian-American chemist, is the second most cited chemist in the world (2000–2010).

Muslims calculated the Earth's circumference, published detailed world maps, and studied elements and minerals.

Under Muslim geographer, al-Khawarizmi, seventy geographers worked together to produce the first map of the globe in 830 CE.




- 34  Al-Idrisi, a Muslim geographer, was hired to produce a world map for the Norman King of Sicily, Roger II.
- 35  Christopher Columbus used maps derived from Al-Idrisi's work, a Muslim geographer, in his explorations of the New World.
